Racing start to fund-raising

Victoria Historic Road Register





The Foundation wishes to acknowledge the generosity of the Victorian Historic Racing Register (VHRR) who ran a Festival of Sport at Phillip Island, 5-8 March. It was the MBF's first up-close motorsport experience and we were blown away! Importantly, it was a great delight to see two volunteer groups coming together to raise \$8,500 towards our \$120,000 pledge to facilitate trans-perineal biopsy machines for South Australia. This was volunteerism at its best and the VHRR can be extremely proud in the knowledge that every dollar will go to supporting blokes in the bush and the people who love them. A huge thank you to the father and son Bennett Racing Team (Laurie and Nick) who turned up at the track

with posties and were press-ganged into joining our ride on the Phillip Island's track.

First Grants to SA totaling \$60,000 posted



With partnership agreements in place with the Riverland/Mallee/ Coorong and Limestone Coast Health Networks, our Board has agreed to make an immediate grant of \$30,000 to each Network. The Board looks forward to the commissioning of TBMs in 2021 and

finalising the second round of grants.

We are keeping in contact with Berri Lions and the Limestone Coast Prostate Support Group to assist in to refining event arrangements for The Postie Bike Ride – see update below.

The Foundation welcomes the initiative by the Federal Minister for Health, The Hon Greg Hunt, to fund more Specialist Prostate Cancer Nurses with funding starting on 1 July 2021. The MBF's wish is that the Riverland / Mallee / Coorong and Limestone Coast Networks are successful, especially as the first hospitals in regional South Australia to offer transperineal biopsies.
